- Develop and deliver specific initiatives that contribute toward the FAW Youth Council's aims & objectives.
- Supporting the development of leadership skills in young people.

ELEEZA KHAN (CHAIR): SOUTH WALES FA

Eleeza is passionate about breaking the stigma that girls like her, from her community, cannot participate in Football. She's already taking a leading role in this, most recently qualifying as a grassroots-level football referee. She also takes a leading role in her community, volunteering with organisations such as the Cardiff Youth Service, SEF Cymru and ACE Cymru.



HARRISON CLAYTON (VICE CHAIR): WEST

Working in sport from 2016, the young sports leader of the year for Brecknock and Radnorshire (2017) found himself as a young ambassador representative on the Sports Wales Board from 2018-2019. Throughout the pandemic, Harrison volunteered as an #IWill ambassador and has gained experience in the digital promotion of the game, as well as planning and directing community sports projects.

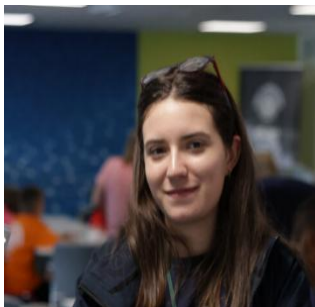
MIA ROBERTS – NORTH EAST WALES FA
