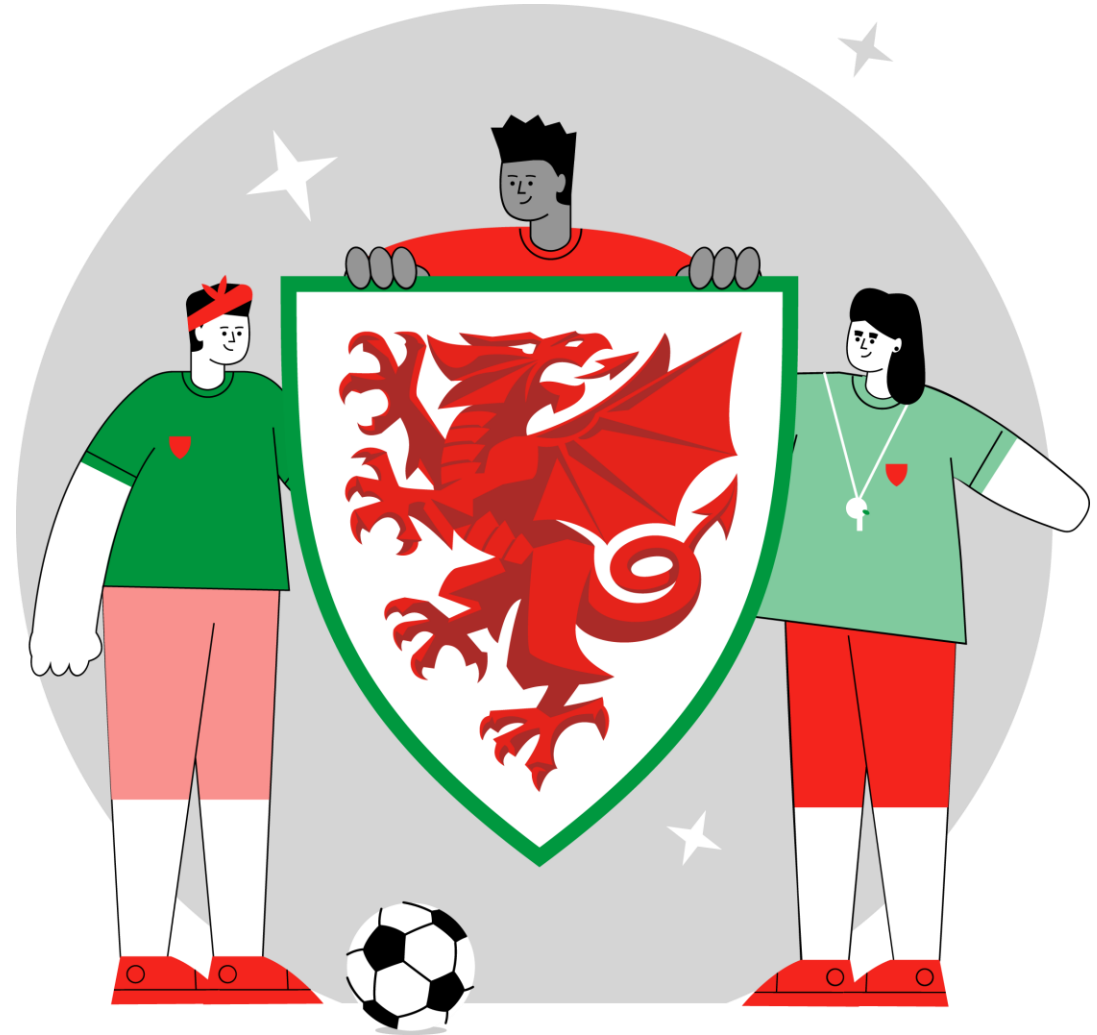
INTRODUCTION:

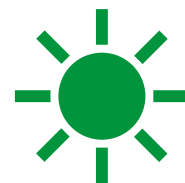

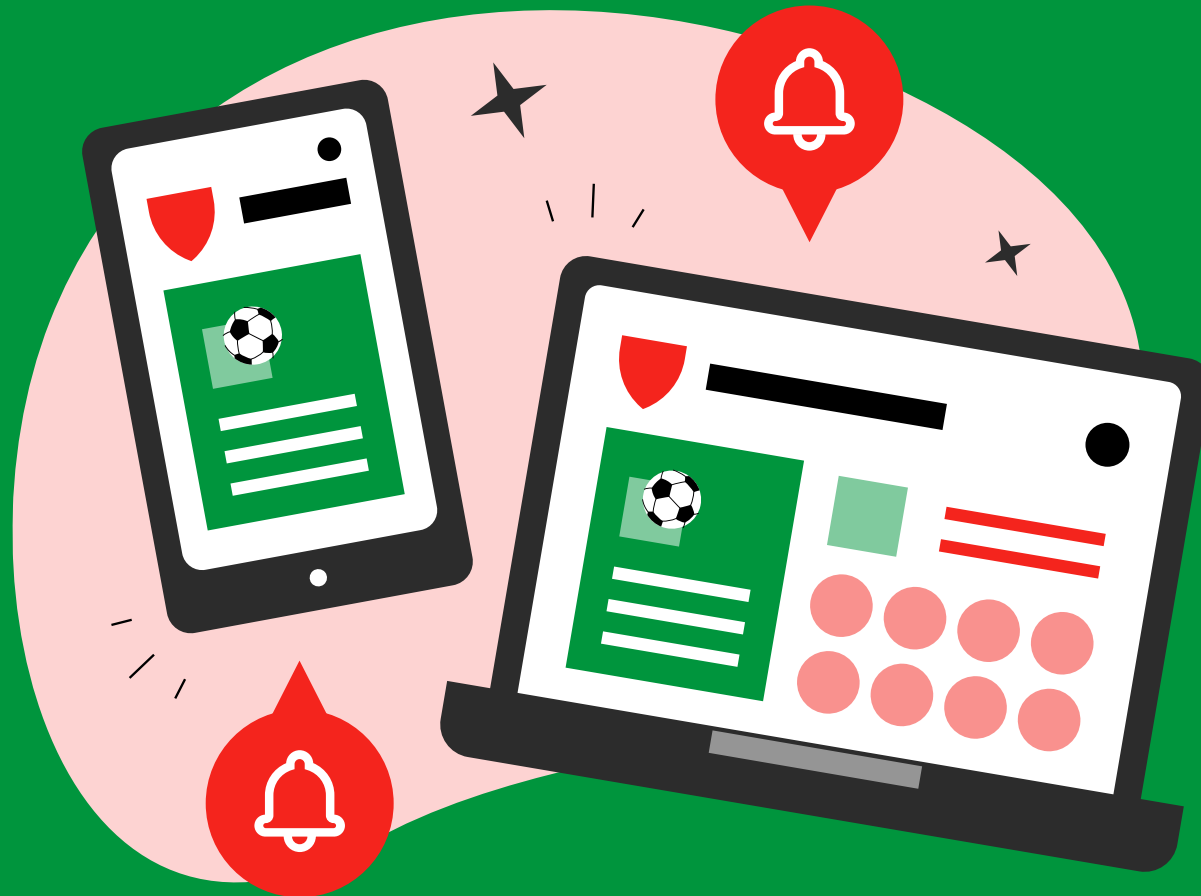

FOOTBALL ACTIVITY & ESPORTS (2:30-4:30 PM)

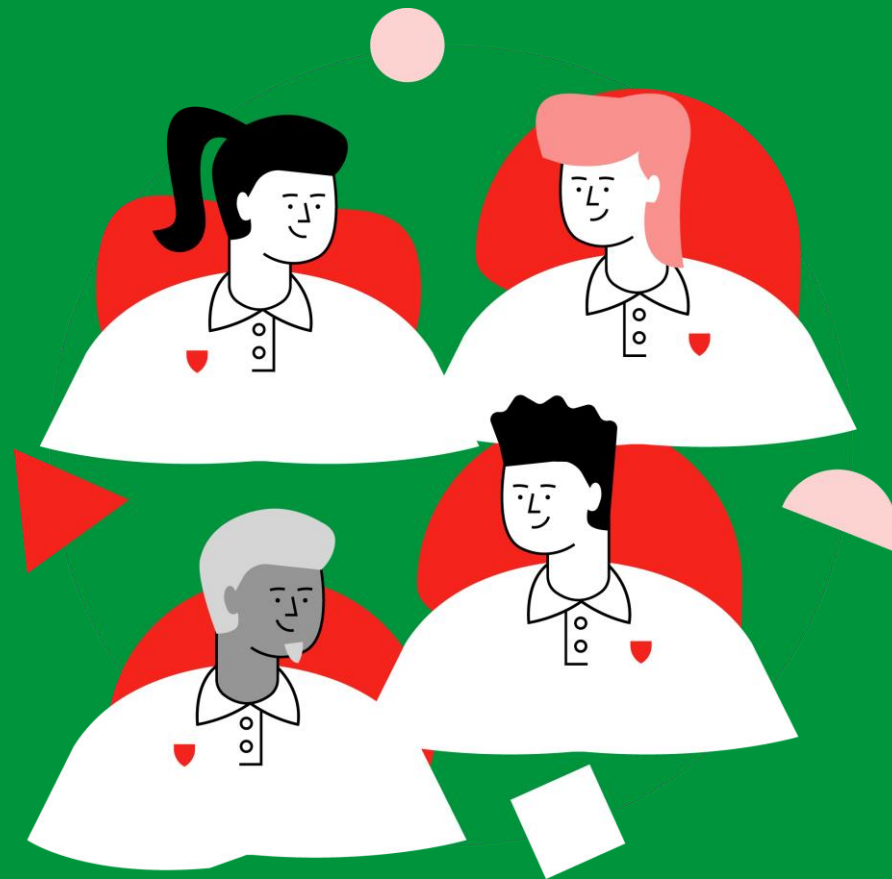
To close the Youth Conference there will be an opportunity to learn from a number of FAW staff across all areas of the game. This session will provide an opportunity for attendees to learn on the pitch skills with our coach education team, effective events management with our participation officers, as well as learning the basics of what it takes to be an official in the game. We encourage attendees to try out all areas of this activity to engage with all areas of the game and learn new skills.

As well as this, attendees will be introduced to Esports Wales through an insightful presentation and interactive session around video gaming, where attendees will get to play either Rocket League or EAFC. Emphasis will be on inexperienced players learning the games, whilst if there are experienced players in attendance these will be designated as coaches and have a short timescale to pass on their knowledge as efficiently as possible.

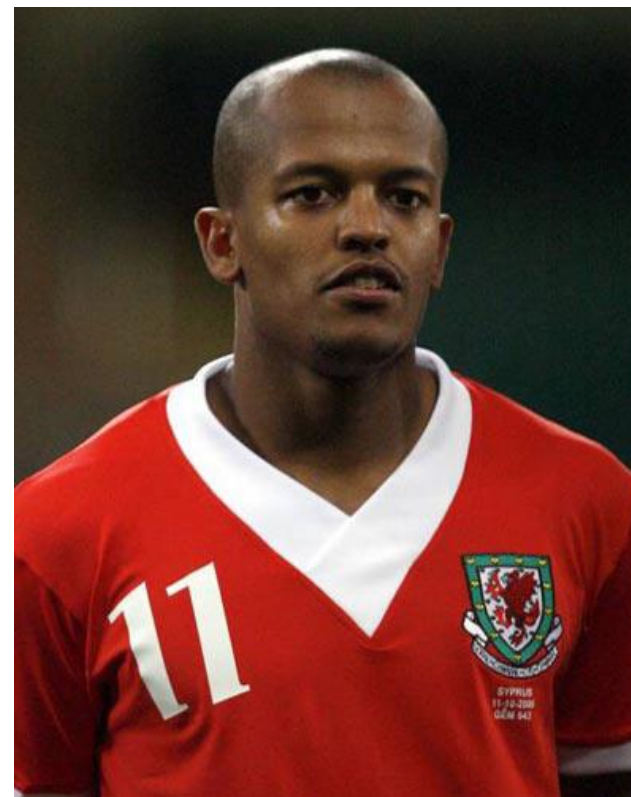

He played 59 times for Cymru scoring 16 goals, the most famous perhaps being on his debut where he netted the winner against Germany in 2002. Since retiring Rob has become a UEFA Pro licensed coach, pundit, Her Game Too Cymru champion and a leading voice in anti-racism discussions across the country.

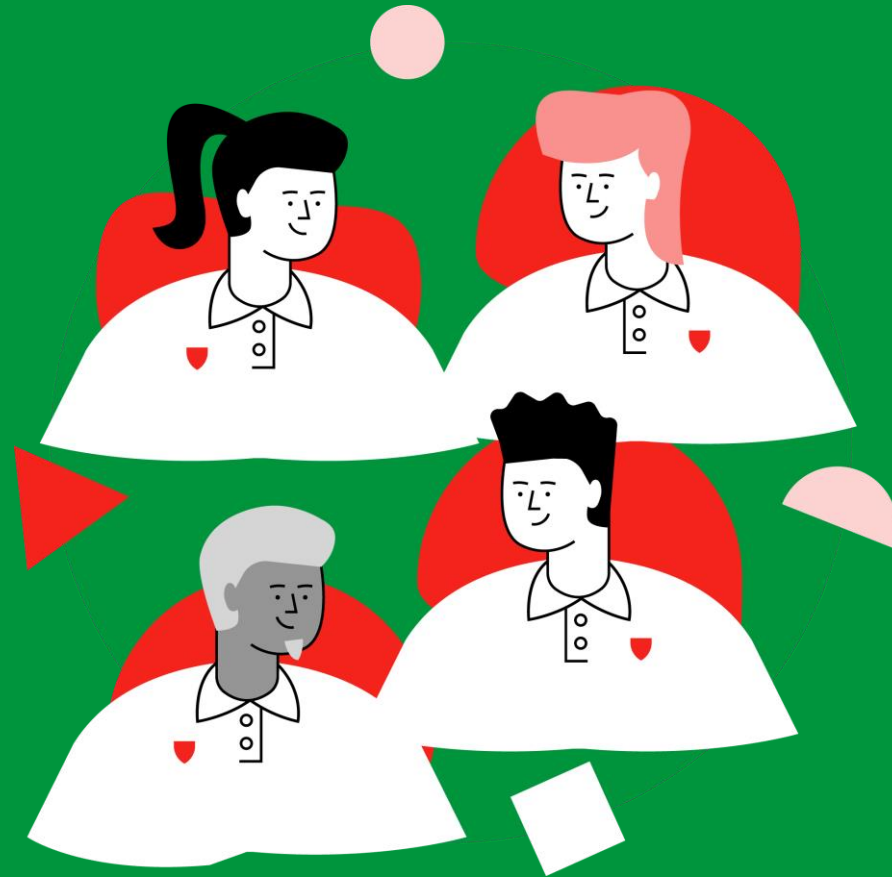

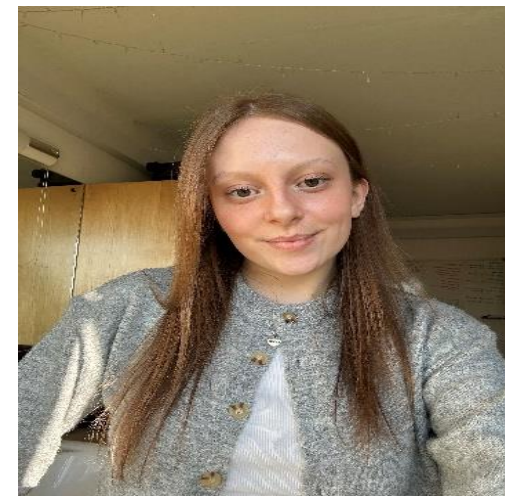

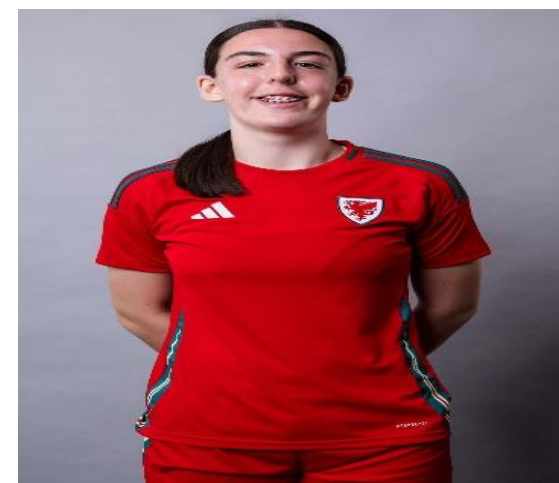
MIA ROBERTS:
